


As mentioned, the January 13th meeting is at 118 S Kansas in Norton. It will be after the State Meeting at the Bullseye Event Center.



Secretary's Report: The October 8th minutes are in the newsletter. Frank moved to waive the reading,


Treasurer's Report: Debbie provided the report.




our event – the city of Easton is good with that idea.

Additionally, in an effort to make sure that members have adequate insurance, lawyers participating in the referral service will be available to review insurance policies and coverages on members' policies at no cost.
